The Facility Planning Committee was formed with an application process in September to study the WBL Area Schools' facilities and develop a comprehensive, long-range Facilities Master Plan for recommendation to the School Board. The facilities study and resulting recommendations will be based on capacity, current enrollment, projected enrollment, educational needs of the School District, alignment with the District's Strategic Vision, community recreation, special programs, school security, and financial stewardship. 

Research, Searching, and Copyright Digital Citizenship

Creative Credit & Copyright

"We live in a digital culture that empowers young people to access information instantly, rework media easily, and share their creations globally. The ease with which young people can find, copy, and distribute digital content can also lead them to use online material without thinking about where it comes from or to whom it belongs. Viewing the Internet as a "free-for-all" leads to problems of copyright infringement, plagiarism, piracy, and a general lack of respect for the hard work and creativity of others. The basic fact is this: Even if something is posted on the Internet for all the world to see, someone somewhere created that picture, song, or article -- and it belongs to that person."

Here is a <u>short video</u> for further information on copyright. You can always find great information at <u>https://www.commonsense.org</u>. They have given us permission to use their site to teach students and parents Digital Citizenship.

Research/Searching

Students today have learned how easy it is to "Google" information. Being a good digital citizen requires all of us to learn to spot credible resources, and how to take information and make it our own or how to credit the writer appropriately. Students may also find that a seemingly innocent search can lead to information that is not appropriate. There are several search engines that can help students find safe and reliable information. Safe Search is a Google product that we use in our school district. Here are some other great search engines for students to use.

- Kiddle
- Kido'z
- Kid Info
- Kids Click
- Kidz Search

These are all recommended by Common Sense Media. Some are more age appropriate for early learners and some for upper elementary.

No matter how careful we are when we search for information a student may come across something inappropriate. At school we teach them to immediately, close out and tell an adult. We can then check their history and block the site.

Digital Citizenship is not a one and done philosophy. It requires all of us to model, teach and communicate with students about the importance of making good choices whenever they are online.
