 - Approve September minutes
 - Motion to approve made by Lauren Schleicher
 - Seconded by Lori Mosser
 - Members voted: September minutes approved!

- **Treasurer's Report - Lauren Schleicher**
 - Current budget by the numbers:
 - Budgeted Expenses: \$52,680.00
 - Actual Expenses YTD: \$13,607.57
 - Projected Income: \$52,680.00
 - Actual Income YTD: \$13,373.68
 - Needed to cover budgeted expenses: \$39,306.32
 - Numbers exclude Bingo Night - final numbers not in
 - Classroom Magazine Subscriptions
 - OVER by almost \$300.
 - Potential to be balanced by other line items
 - Fall Fundraiser Update

- Cash/checks: \$9,860.00
 - Paypal Gross: \$4,770.00
 1. Paypal Expenses: \$163.66 (fees)
 2. Paypal NET: \$4,6016.34
 3. Checked on Venmo - not currently available to nonprofits
 4. Katy Matuzak suggested using Fundraise Genius
 - Expenses: \$1,092.66
 - NET Income: \$13,373.68
 - Short by \$11,626.32
 1. additional \$930 in stragglers that came in late 10/11 and 10/14
 - Extending fundraiser by 1.5 week
 1. will run through Friday, October 25th (because of MEA)
 2. announced at Bingo, PTA Meeting, and in a Messenger email blast
 - After 10/28, funds donated will go toward Direct Donations line item
 - Needed: ideas and volunteers to create donation letters
- Suggested that we split Bingo Night and Rollerskating Night into separate line items next year
 - Easier to track individual estimated expenses, etc.

 - Stephanie Lohmann seconded the motion
 - Members voted - Signers Approved

 - Motion made by Michelle Allshouse
 - Motion seconded by Angela Thompson
 - Members voted: Budget Approved!

4. Principals' Reports

- Lori Mosser -
 - Loves working at Oneka and seeing everything that is happening!
 - Extended Day Family Night
 - Monday, Oct 21, 5:15 to 7:00
 - Lights On After School
 - nationwide event celebrating after school programs
 - Pizza and DJ
 - All school Bingo on Halloween
 - no costumes
 - students encouraged to wear black/orange/spirit wear
 - Girls On The Run
 - Citizen (local paper) contacted Lori to write an article

- Practice 5K on Oneka Parkway 10/28
 - 5K Race/Celebration at Mall of America- Sunday, November 10th
 - Jason Healy - No report; unable to attend
 - Lori read an update notice from Brian Morris - filling in for Jason
 - Kindergarteners are seeing themselves as readers and writers in literacy and building their number sense in math.
 - First graders are working on being good partner readers in class, writing Small Moment Stories in their journals, and learning simple addition and subtraction.
 - Students learning about empathy in the Second Step curriculum.
 - Theme ties in with this month's book in the Hugo Story Series, "Do Unto Otters".
 - Every student at Hugo will receive a copy of "Do Unto Otters" will participate in a schoolwide activity about the book, and classroom activities related to the book.
 - Kindergarten - 1st Halloween parade at 2:30

5. President's Report - Angela Thompson

- Bond Referendum
 - Vote Yes Committee contacted Angela to get a feel for how things were going in the Hugo area
 - mostly positive
 - Christi Anthony asked if the PTA allowed to promote voting "Yes"?
 - PTA - YES; staff - NO
 - vote Yes shared on PTA website
 - Christi is on the Vote Yes committee
 - making sure information is at school activities
 - back-to-school night, Bingo night, Halloween parade
 - not create a new event, but be present at scheduled events
 - Early voting open now
- Reminder of open President position
 - Angela will need to step down in January, if elected to School Board
- All board positions open for 2020-2021
 - positions are one-year term
 - two year limit in a specific role
 - Angela, Katie, Lauren, & Toni all completing 2nd year in roles
 - Chrissi could return to VP role (completing her 1st year)
- Boosterthon Glow Run
 - Will be held in place of Adult Game Night
 - Game Night was fun, but was a lot of work for little return
 - All school Glow Run in gym (Jan.) and potential school community color run (May)
 - Matt from Boosterathon will come to the November meeting to share more detailed information

- Great program that involves both schools
 - includes 8 days of character building by Boosterthon staff
- Guarantee ~\$22,000 profit
 - Will cover deficit, if do not reach goal
 - Pull in national sponsorship

6. Committee Chair Reports

- Fall Fundraiser Direct Donation Drive - Lauren Schleicher
 - We asked teachers and parents to share feedback.
 - Many heard good things
 - liked not selling “stuff”
 - missed the active student involvement piece
 - Cassandra Gomez shared that although parents originally wanted it (spring survey), kind of regretted it after living with it
 - lack of student involvement/drive
 - Discussion of underestimating the value of incentives
 - especially from kids’ perspective
 - no big assembly to get started; used to get kids pumped up
 - no goal rewards (pizza with principals)
 - Katy Matuzak shared how she has involved kids in writing letters to request money in other (non-school) fundraisers
 - successful, but labor intensive/time-consuming
 - Becca Engberg - suggested a Gala
 - Fun event; community building for Hugo and Oneka
 - Big population to pull from
 - Way for parents to give money and get something in return
 - Discussion of past similar events (Gold Plate Dinner) and other schools, especially Lincoln who run similar events
 - Potentially looking at Fall of 2020
 - PTA board/members suggested that Becca do some research and bring ideas to share
 - excitement to learn/hear more
- Bingo - Stephanie Lohmann
 - Very well attended
 - Estimated ~525 people
 - Expenses ~\$250
 - Need to still make returns of extra food
 - Need to figure out more tables for next year
 - We used all cafeteria tables/got 4 tables from Hugo Lions Club
 - We didn’t have tables from Matt Thompson, like the past two years
 - Don’t want people to not come because too busy/no seating
 - Stephanie suggested keeping same budget to allow for table rental
 - Elizabeth Ulmer questioned the Bounce House
 - Is it needed?
 - distraction to Bingo

- hard to manage
 - Christi Anthony commented that it is a draw, especially for younger children; suggested announcement to parents to control/parent children (not a free-for-all)
 - may need adults working crowd control/Bounce House shifts
 - add to Sign-Up Genius
 - 408 pounds of food to Hugo Food Shelf
 - more than last year
 - New chair needed - someone to shadow
 - Stephanie here to help one more year
 - Suggestion made by Angela Thompson to add two board members to count money to the organization/to-do list (Sign-Up Genius)
 - Could count after event
 - Money could be locked in vault and counted at a later date/time
- Candy Buy Back - Katie Jones
 - Signature Orthodontics sponsored contest for local elementary schools
 - Bring in extra/unwanted wrapped Halloween candy to our schools
 - Friday, November 1st - Monday, November 4th
 - Candy due at Signature by 5pm on 11/4
 - school that donates the most amount (weight) of candy wins money
 - \$1.00/pound of the total amount that school donated (\$1,000 max)
 - All candy will be donated to the Ronald McDonald House
 - Katie will be looking for people to help transport candy on 11/4.
- Oneka Fall Book Fair - Kari Milhofer
 - November 18th-21st
 - Will cover 2nd conference night
 - Includes a non-school day
 - Not sure of 3rd grade math event that has overlapped in past years
 - Note: Elizabeth Ulmer emailed Katie Jones/Kari Milhofer on 10/16 to notify that 3rd grade math dates had been set for Nov. 19 and Nov. 20, starting at noon with the biggest rush anticipated for 12:20-1:00
 - Money earned goes to both schools (Scholastic Dollars)
 - Includes all teacher wish lists
 - Can buy a book to donate to classroom/teacher
 - New location
 - Back of media center, by glass classroom
 - Theme - Arctic Adventure
 - Katie Solem asked if All For Books (round up purchase) money could go towards books for weekend food bags
 - Volunteers earn \$5 Scholastic Money for every shift
 - Sign-Up Genius to come soon
- Box Tops - Katie Solem
 - 1st submission coming in November
 - Discussion about past contest to reward top classroom for each grade
 - Feasible with electronic submission?

- Can't track
 - Discussed a school-wide goal
 - again, hard to gauge (amount) with new receipt scanning
 - discussed setting a low goal to boost interest and moral
 - reward for all students - popcorn; pjs
- Boosterthon Glow Run - Confirm Committee Chairs
 - Will discuss in more detail at November meeting
- Yearbook - Michelle Allshouse
 - Photos coming in
 - Promote with staff, especially older grades
 - Need to set up a Google drive to share photos - Lori will work with Kristy Rockford, Joelle Sather, Jen Durand
 - Lauren Schleicher mentioned ~\$444 deposit from yearbook add-ons made over the summer
 - Katie Solem asked about scholarships for those who cannot afford
 - Michelle stated that there is already something built in
 - not formal - based on free/reduced lunch list
 - works with Kristy Rockford to determine need

7. Funding Requests

- Amy Corner (2nd grade) - Bussing to Keystone 2 times/year
 - 1.5 hours
 - Students play math games, recite poetry, recite reader's theatre
 - Asking for \$90 for bussing
 - Lauren Schleicher - made a motion to approve
 - Michelle Allshouse - seconded the motion
 - Members voted: Motion passed
- Katy Matuzak (K-2nd Music) - Flexible Seating
 - Has great space at Hugo; needs seating options
 - Currently only floor seating
 - Does not work for all students
 - Lessons involve a lot of movement; but flexible seating needed
 - Balance balls, lap desk; options other than floor with clipboard
 - Spread out seating (not all on top of one another)
 - Allow for movement
 - Seating would benefit 300+ students
 - Asking for \$500 for various flexible seating options
 - Christi Anthony - made a motion to approve
 - Brian Cern - seconded the motion
 - Members voted: Motion passed

8. Open Forum

- Everyone Belongs - Lauren Schleicher
 - Inclusion project of the Forest Lake area
 - Joint project with Forest Lake Area School District and the YMCA Equity Innovation Center - including surrounding areas

- Goals
 - Bridge cultural differences; understand diversity; create awareness of cultural uniqueness; recognize opportunities for inclusion
- Learning Series - all sessions held at Forest Lake High School Cafeteria
 - Oct. 29th 6-8:30pm - Unconscious Bias
 - November 12th 6-8:30pm - Dimensions of Diversity
 - November 19th 6-8:30pm - Cultural Lens
 - free childcare available
- free - open to all community members
- clock hours (CEUs) available to teachers/admin.
- Katie Solem - books for weekend bags
 - Wondering about reimbursement
