On behalf of the entire staff we would like to welcome you to our Hugo and Oneka Elementary School community. These early conferences helped us to get to know your children in a more meaningful manner than our previous open house format. We also now have updated contact information for nearly every family.

We encourage family and community members to volunteer in our schools. We require all volunteers to complete a background check before working with children in our schools. This will help ensure the safety of our students. Volunteer packets can be obtained in either school office. We know that we can teach students who are at school. Therefore, at Oneka, we are going to have a monthly celebration for perfect attendance. All students who are in school 100% of the school days each month will receive a perfect attendance certificate and their names will be placed in a drawing for a special breakfast to be held on the first Friday of each month. Students attending the breakfast will be asked to invite a "special adult" in their lives to join them. We don't expect students to come to school when they are ill so if they get sick during September, not to worry, they could be eligible for perfect attendance certificates and luncheons the next month.

Finally, you can get involved with your student's education in a variety of ways. I encourage you to participate in PTA sponsored events. Our first meeting is Monday, September 17 at 6:00 pm in the Oneka Media Center. See you there.

Drop-Off/Pick-Up procedures


Morning Drop-Off - 8:55 am at Hugo, 9:00 am at Oneka

Your child's safety is also ensured when you have your child(ren) exit the vehicle on the right side (curb side) only. For those of you parking, please walk your child into the building using the crosswalk.

Afternoon Pick-Up - 3:35 pm at Hugo, 3:42pm at Oneka

Please park your vehicle in the parking lot and come inside to the cafeteria to sign out your student..

Curbside Pickup Is available at Oneka for those who have a child under 2 years of age or have a limitation that does not allow ease of walking. If that describes you, please stop in the office to register. You must have an Oneka curbside pick up sign in your vehicle to park at the curb. There is no curbside parking at Hugo.



Hugo Before/After School Parking & Pick-up Procedures

Dear Hugo Families,

As we prepare for our PreK-1 students I thought this would be a great opportunity to remind everyone about the parking procedures we have established at Hugo. <u>Following these procedures will help ensure the safety of our students at Hugo Elementary and will reduce the likelihood of an accident in the lot.</u>

Please park in a parking spot in our main parking lot (A). You can also park just past the fire hydrant parallel with the sidewalk. If there are no spots available, DO NOT park anywhere you see yellow on the curb. Our students are small and it makes it a real safety hazard if cars are parked in these areas. If the lot is full, please use the church parking lot next door (B) instead. In the winter time, a trail is plowed for your convenience.

As you can see, I have included a 'birds eye" view of our parking spaces and where to and not to park. Using the map, please do NOT park anywhere you see a red line or a red dashed line. If you are simply dropping off your child in the AM and not going inside or walking them inside, please feel free to continue using the red dashed line space. I would appreciate it if you would forward this email to anyone else that may be picking up your child so they are aware of this important procedure.

Also, our goal this year is for the buses to leave Hugo by 3:35 pm. It is crucial that you use the HugoDismissalRequest@isd624.org if you are planning on picking up your child when they normally ride the bus. There is less likely to be a mistake made on our part if you make these requests in the morning. If you do so late in the afternoon or simply email or call the teacher, there's a chance that they won't get the message. Our teachers are busy instructing children and quite often they do not have time to check their emails/phone messages during the day. If you do email/call the teacher and you don't hear back from them, the child will more than likely be put on the bus and then you will have to pick them up over at Oneka.

Thank you for your compliance and help making Hugo Elementary a safe place for our children.

Regular attendance is essential for good progress in school. We monitor attendance each day to verify when and **why** children are absent. A student is required by law to attend school. If they miss a school day or part of the day, for legitimate reasons, a parent or guardian must notify the school. **A** parent or guardian must seek an excused absence, however, the school administrator has the right to accept or deny an application for an excused absence.

Examples of excused absences include:

Sickness (a doctor's note may be required)
Medical or mental health appointments
Religious Holidays
Family Emergency

Some Examples of unexcused absences include:

Missing the bus Need of sleep or rest Sporting Events Child is not immunized



<u>Tardies</u>: A child will be marked tardy if they arrive to school between 9:15a - 10:00a.

½ **Day Absence**: If a child arrives after 10 AM or leaves before 3:00pm they will be considered absent for a half day (either AM or PM).

Early Release: ***Important***

If a child leaves school after 3:00p they will be marked as either an excused or unexcused early release.

Three (3) unexcused tardies/early releases will be considered ½ day unexcused absence.

If we do not hear from you by 10 a.m., it is our practice to call your home or work number to determine the whereabouts of your child.

*When bringing your child in late, an adult <u>must</u> sign him/her in at the office.



Vacations must be pre-approved by the building administration. Vacations may be considered unexcused if the family has been alerted to an attendance issue or if not preapproved by the building administration.

Washington County recommends to school districts to excuse only up to 5 vacation days outside the established breaks in the school calendar.
